A moving story

The Cafe to leave Louisville Antique Mall

Tomato dill, chicken potpie and black bean with sausage soups are all moving, along with the other outstanding dishes served for lunch at The Cafe at the Louisville Antique Mall.

For nearly 11 years, Cindy Rubino and her staff have turned out some of Louisville's most satisfying lunch dishes from the upstairs, around the corner, through the nook location at the Louisville Antique Mall, 900 Goss Ave. (Poplar Level turns into Goss north of Eastern Parkway).

The Cafe will move to the corner of Brent and Vine streets (near Louisville Stoneware) in September or October, says Rubino.

The new location will offer several advantages.

"We'll have our own place," said Rubino, instead of having to wait to get into their kitchen until 10 a.m. when the doors open at the mall.

At the new place, they'll be able to offer breakfast in addition to lunch, and perhaps carryout dinner in the future.

Second, the new location has a parking lot across the street.

Also, the kitchen space is doubling, allowing more catering capabilities (office delivery), along with those extra mealtimes.

The plan, says Rubino, is to close the antique mall location one day and open up on Vine Street the next. The new building is being transformed from industrial to commercial space. Currently, "there is a huge crane in the middle of it," said Rubino.
