**Cafe recreated**

New location on Brent Street serves neighbors well

Cindy and Sal Rubino have been welcoming customers to The Cafe's new site in Paristown Pointe, and they plan to add outdoor seating in the spring.

They moved their cafe -- which operated for 11 years at the Louisville Antique Mall, 900 Goss Ave. in Schnitzelburg -- to a building they renovated at 712 Brent St., near Louisville Stoneware. The Rubinos, who live in the Belknapp neighborhood, said they would love to see other shops along Brent Street.

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They've added breakfast since the cafe opened Oct. 30. Sal Rubino said [business](#) has doubled, and "We've had a warm welcome from all the neighbors."

The cafe is open 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily.

"It's pretty neat how some things don't change," server Sandy Morrison said. The Cafe is still near railroad tracks, like it was on

Goss Avenue, and much of the decor and furnishings are the same.

"They brought the funky lights," said Paula Bohnert of Seneca Gardens, referring to the chandeliers. She was sitting at a table recently with her niece, Lori Feris of Germantown and Feris' daughter, Zoe, 3. "We're Highlanders, so it's closer for us," Bohnert said. "We've been here more."

The Louisville Antique Mall also is moving -- to a renovated building at Broadway and Campbell Street. It expects to begin the move Jan. 12 and reopen at the new location Jan. 19.

The mall will have a new cafe on the fifth floor, though it might not be open right away, owner Denise Golden said. The cafe will be accessible for evening events, even when the mall is not open, she said.

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Harry and Ann Bickel of the Cherokee Triangle, longtime customers at The Cafe, were there for lunch recently and stopped to talk to the Rubinos on their way out. "It's our favorite place to eat," Harry Bickel said.

Ann Bickel said they started eating at The Café when there were only a few tables at the antique mall location. She joked that their only complaint is that the cafe is so busy now that they sometimes have to wait for a table.
